Award-Winning Author and TV Personality Trevor Romain to Entertain Military Schoolchildren on USO Tour to Germany

ARLINGTON, Va. – Best-selling children’s author, television personality and performer Trevor Romain will visit with and perform for U.S. military schoolchildren stationed in Germany as part of a USO tour October 14. This is Romain’s third USO tour, having mesmerized youngsters in Okinawa, Guam and Germany with his trademark performances, side-splitting antics and heart-warming stories.

Devoted to supporting the armed forces, Romain served with the South African Army for two years and, while a soldier, experienced a life-changing encounter with a severely injured child that cemented his fate – to one day work with kids. Gifted with an uncanny ability to connect with children and empower them to face life’s challenges, Romain has traveled to schools and hospitals for years. Whether he’s delivering stand-up comedy to children, hanging out with terminally ill kids, reading aloud to hordes of young people, or filming the latest installment of his DVD series, Romain has a profound impact on millions of children.

“I love traveling with the USO,” says Romain. “I know first hand how military life can be – continually relocating, adapting to new surroundings, adjusting life to deployments and working nontraditional hours – it can be hard on kids. Anything I can do to help them, I will.”

Known for his humor and creative flair, Romain is the author of a collection of self-help books for children including, “Bullies Are A Pain In The Brain,” “How To Do Homework Without Throwing Up,” and “What On Earth Do You Do When Someone Dies?” Having published his books in more than 15 languages and sold more than one million copies worldwide, Romain has become one of the most popular motivational speakers for children. The host of an award-winning animated DVD series, including favorites like “Taking the “Duh” Out Of Divorce” and “Facing Fear Without Freaking Out,” Romain is also the president of The Trevor Romain Company, a children’s education publishing company committed to producing engaging materials to help kids become socially and emotionally fit.
